Community Update:

Bridgeland Riverside Continuing Care Centre



Overview

- The \$130.5 million Bridgeland Riverside Continuing Care Centre (BRCCC) is a stand-alone facility being constructed in the Bridgeland community on the northwest corner of the site previously occupied by the now demolished Cross Bow Continuing Care Centre.
- The Bridgeland Riverside Continuing Care Centre will help address a shortage of spaces for Calgarians requiring continuing and complex care. The new centre will also free up hospital beds for patients requiring active treatment.
- The new Bridgeland Riverside Continuing Care Centre will create a space for almost 200 individuals.
- The facility is designed to support the residents through patient and family centered care concepts that include the incorporation of natural light, pathways and gardens.
- The Bridgeland Riverside Continuing Care facility will be run in partnership with Carewest, a wholly-owned subsidiary of AHS, who has a long history of providing care to seniors and adults with complex care needs.
- In addition to residential care, the facility will also provide outpatient and day program services for seniors.



Construction update

- Construction continues on the West Tower.
- Level four is poured forming the 5th floor slab.
- Construction continues for the remaining structure - foundation walls and core walls.
- Water proofing and insulation work is continuing on the perimeter foundation walls of the building.
- Mechanical and electrical infrastructure installations are in progress.
- Tower crane has been installed in the southwest courtyard.
- Slab on grade for remainder of the building is being prepared and poured.



What's to come

- Construction started in early January, 2021 and is scheduled to be completed in late 2023.
- Local student artwork is being printed on banners and will soon be installed on the construction fence.
