## Tips to Communicate With A Person With Hearing Challenges

- 1. Ask questions about how the person communicates
- 2. Get the person's attention
- 3. Make sure you are facing the person in good lighting (Procedure masks hide your lips!)
- 4. Speak slowly and clearly
- 5. Allow people access to all of their assistive devices throughout their care
- 6. Some people, especially children and those with dexterity issues may require support
- 7. Write down important information on a notepad, clipboards, boogie board or tablet
- 8. Rephrase or repeat the information when it is not understood. Take steps to ensure the person has understood by having them repeat back the information
- 9. Avoid noisy backgrounds for conversations
- 10. When people are unable to access their assistive devices, use a symbol board (e.g., recovery, intensive care)
- 11. Access resources available to you: staff onsite (e.g., SLP, audiologist, contact the patients vendor, cochlear implant center)
