

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

To: 2020873 Alberta Ltd.
"the Owner"

RE: The food establishment located in Canmore, Alberta and municipally described as:
The Canmore Hotel Restaurant
738 Main Street

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. The kitchen dishwasher is not consistently reaching at least 71C at dish level.
- b. The temperature gauge for the rinse cycle of the dishwasher is not accurate and there is no waterproof thermometer with a maximum temperature recording function for checking the rinse water temperature at dish level.
- c. There is a build-up of oil and food debris on the floor under the cooking equipment, as well as a build-up of food debris on the walls around the hand sink and dish machine.
- d. A written cleaning schedule is not being maintained.
- e. There is a gap under the kitchen door leading to the outside which could allow the entry of rodents.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. The kitchen dishwasher is not consistently reaching at least 71C at dish level. This is in contravention of Section 28(2) of the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 which states "A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination."
- b. The temperature gauge for the rinse cycle of the dishwasher is not accurate and there is no waterproof thermometer with a maximum temperature recording function for checking the rinse water temperature at dish level. This is in contravention of Section 28(2) of the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 which states "A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination."
- c. There is a build-up of oil and food debris on the floor under the cooking equipment, as well as a build-up of food debris on the walls around the hand sink and dish machine. This is in contravention of Section 28(2) of the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 which

states "A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination."

- d. A written cleaning schedule is not being maintained. This is in contravention of Section 29 of the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 which states "A commercial food establishment must have written procedures designed to ensure its safe and sanitary operation and maintenance."
- e. There is a gap under the kitchen door leading to the outside which could allow the entry of rodents. This is in contravention of Section 17(2) of the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 which states "The operator must ensure that the commercial food establishment is constructed to control the entry of pests."

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Serve customers with only single-use disposable utensils, other than glassware that can be put through the bar glasswasher, until such time as the dish machine is adequately sanitizing utensils as confirmed by a Public Health Inspector with Alberta Health Services.
 - b. Obtain a waterproof thermometer with a maximum temperature recording function to check the temperature of the dish machine rinse water at dish level.
 - c. Clean the floor under the cooking equipment and the walls around the hand sink and dishwasher and continue to clean these areas regularly to maintain them in a clean condition.
 - d. Create a detailed written cleaning schedule to facilitate the proper cleaning of all areas of the food establishment, including equipment, and structural surfaces. The cleaning schedule must be submitted to an Alberta Health Services Executive Officer for review.
 - e. Adequately close of the gap under the kitchen door that leads to the outside to prevent rodent entry.
2. The work referred to in paragraph 1a shall be completed immediately and the work referred to in paragraph 1b-e shall be completed by June 5, 2023.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
